## **How to get to Royal Hotel Carlton**

Arriving by Plane: If you're flying into Bologna, you'll most likely land at Bologna Guglielmo Marconi Airport (BLQ), which is approximately 6 km from the city center. The Aerobus service, also known as the BLQ shuttle, runs from the airport to the city center. You can get off at the Bologna Centrale railway station, which is a short walk or a quick taxi ride from the Royal Hotel Carlton. Taxis are also available at the airport. The ride to the hotel should take about 15-20 minutes, depending on traffic.

Arriving by Train and Bus: The Royal Hotel Carlton is about a 10-15 minute walk from the Bologna Centrale station. You can walk down Via dell'Indipendenza, a major street lined with shops and cafes, which leads directly to the area near the hotel.

**Arriving by Car:** To reach the hotel using satellite navigation, it should be set for Via Milazzo 6 to avoid the restricted traffic zone.

### Moving around in Bologna

The Royal Hotel Carlton is in the centre of Bologna, near the pedestrian area, outside the restricted traffic zone and just a short walk from the railway station and Piazza Maggiore.

### **General Information**

**Banks** are open Monday to Friday around 8:30 to 2:00 and often reopen again in the afternoon from 3:00 to 4:30. ATMs are available 24/7. ATMs in Italy are known as "Bancomats".

Weather in May & Clothing Recommendations: In May, Bologna experiences a transition from spring to early summer, with generally pleasant weather. The average daytime temperatures range from 15°C to 25°C, with warmer temperatures toward the end of the month. You can expect plenty of sunshine, with longer daylight hours as summer approaches. May can see some rainfall, but it's usually less than the peak rainy season. You may encounter occasional showers or thunderstorms, particularly in the latter half of the month. Bring a mix of clothing suitable for varying temperatures. Light sweaters, long-sleeve shirts, and light jackets are useful for cooler mornings and evenings.

**Shopping:** Opening Hours, Monday to Saturday: 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM. Sundays: Many shops, especially smaller, independent ones, are closed on Sundays. However, larger stores and those in tourist areas or shopping malls may remain open, offering reduced hours compared to weekdays.

Places to eat: Bologna is renowned for its rich culinary tradition, offering a wide array of dining options to suit every taste. Trattorias and Osterias are traditional Italian eateries where you can enjoy authentic Bolognese dishes. It's often a good idea to make reservations, especially for popular restaurants, particularly during peak dining times. You can also explore Bologna's street food scene, where you can sample specialties like panini with cured meats, fried snacks, and gelato from vendors throughout the city.

Service charge and gratuities: Many restaurants in Bologna apply a "coperto" charge, which is a cover charge per person for sitting at a table. This charge typically covers the cost of bread, tableware, and service and usually ranges from €1 to €3 per person. In Italy, tipping is seen as a gesture of appreciation for exceptional service rather than an obligatory part of dining out. It's entirely discretionary and should reflect your satisfaction with the service received.

**Power supply:** The standard voltage is 230 volts, and the frequency is 50 Hz. The standard plug type used in Italy is the Type F plug, which has two round pins and a grounding pin. This plug is compatible with sockets in Bologna and throughout Italy.

**Medical care:** Ospedale Maggiore is one of the main hospitals in Bologna and offers a wide range of medical services, including emergency care, surgery, and specialized treatments.
